# A HEARTWARMING INTERACTION WITH VISUALLY IMPAIRED STUDENTS

On February 18, our college, Hindustan Academy witnessed a truly meaningful and inspiring event as students from a blind foundation visited the campus. The event was hosted by the Young Minds International Club of Rising Stars, Bangalore District, bringing together club members and visually impaired students for a day filled with learning, empathy, and connection.

The program began with a presidential address by the International President Dr. K. C. Samuel, also the Chief Guest, setting a positive and inclusive tone for the day. This was followed by an engaging interactive session organized by the club members.

During this session, the visually impaired students openly shared their daily life experiences, challenges, and achievements. Their stories highlighted not only the struggles they face but also their incredible resilience, independence, and talents - especially their impressive singing skills.



One of the most impactful moments of the event was when the visually impaired students were guided to explore the aircraft on campus. With the help of the club members, they were able to touch, feel, and sit inside the aircraft, gaining a unique sensory understanding of how air planes function. This hands-on experience created a memorable and inclusive learning environment for everyone involved.

The club also arranged lunch for the visiting students, where members actively assisted by serving food and ensuring everyone was comfortable. This simple act of care strengthened the bond between the participants and reflected the true spirit of compassion and service.

Additionally, the interaction provided valuable insights into how visually impaired students pursue their education. Club members were introduced to Braille and computer-assistive tools that facilitate access to effective learning and exam writing for the visually impaired, showcasing how technology empowers inclusivity.

By the end of the event, strong connections had been formed. The students and club members exchanged social media contacts and continued to stay in touch, extending the impact of the event beyond just one day.

Overall, the visit was not just an event but an eye-opening experience that fostered empathy, understanding, and mutual respect. It reminded everyone present of the importance of inclusivity and the strength of the human spirit.

# INDIA AREA REPORT PRESENTED AT THIRD PRESIDUM MEETING

at Gokulam Grand, Calicut, on 1st March 2026



At the outset, let me congratulate everyone working tirelessly for the overall growth of Young Minds International. A testament to this reality is the inauguration of new clubs in Korea and Australia. The groundwork for the formation of new clubs in the USA and UAE has also been completed, with their inauguration scheduled for this month. While our growth has been steady, there remain many regions yet to be explored.

## MIDYEAR MEETING

The India Area Mid-Year Meeting was held on 9th–10th January at the Icon of the Lakes, a luxury houseboat in Alleppey. The 22 leaders who attended the meeting carried back a lot of cherished memories with them. The meeting discussed in detail, various issues requiring immediate attention. Strategic plans were finalised to update the roster with email IDs in the digital platform, ensure timely payment of dues, identify unaccounted payments received, strengthen the focus on youth clubs, drive global expansion and initiate the formation of a senate at every level.

## YOUTH CAMP

The three-day Youth Camp planned at Dhoni College, Palakkad, could not materialise due to a lack of confirmed registrations, despite all arrangements - including faculty - being in place. What would have been a wonderful opportunity for the youth to interact, engage, and grow had to be postponed/cancelled. It is hoped that, in the future, regions will take greater initiative in identifying and encouraging interested youth to participate.

## REGION-I

The pace of club extension in Region 1, under the leadership of Sibi Augustine, is truly commendable. The District Governors have worked as a team with the Region and also deserve special appreciation. The Region now comprises 36 clubs with 570 members.

Projects in support of the needy and image building programmes are given special interest. Notably, projects worth ₹53 lakhs have already been carried out by various clubs across the Region. It is also heartening to note the growth of more clubs in the Kanyakumari area. Additionally, a new district-District 6-has been inaugurated, comprising of clubs in Adoor, Alleppey, and Pathanamthitta.

## REGION-II

The regional team, headed by Jose Alphonse, continues their journey with a wide range of impactful activities. The number of clubs in the Region has increased to 32, with membership also showing good improvement and currently standing at 510 members. Region 2 has consistently shown tremendous commitment to social

service initiatives. Home for Homeless project and donation of dialysis machine are worth mentioning. To strengthen community and family bonds, a grand Family Fest was also conducted.

## REGION-III

Regional Chair Ranjith Kumar K is leading the Region with deep commitment. The social initiatives undertaken by the clubs in the Region are highly notable, with the Home for the Homeless projects earning special appreciation in society. District 3 has shown rapid growth, with 24 Clubs as of now and poised to add 10 more by the year end. The Region now comprises 37 clubs with a membership of 566. Data updates in the portal have been completed on time; and training programmes for PSTs and Programme Directors have also been successfully conducted.

## REGION-IV

Regional Chair Sakthivel N. S. is a strong motivator and the Region is showing fast growth. Two new clubs have been established in Chennai. Through their collective efforts, a new club was also inaugurated in Sydney, Australia. The Region has shown a keen interest in the formation of Youth Clubs. The various charitable programmes carried out by the clubs are praiseworthy. Currently, the Region comprises two districts with 17 clubs and a total membership of 230.

## REGION-V

Under the leadership of B. V. N. Rao, the Region is working steadily towards further expansion. Currently, there are three Clubs and a District. Plans are underway for more extension to make the District & Region viable within the existing constraints. Image-building programmes have successfully brought Young Minds International into the limelight within the locality.

Let me thank one and all for the support extended; and hats off to the International Team for their guidance and motivation.

In the brain, this releases oxytocin, deepening trust and team cohesion.

Leadership Insight: Every "thank you" is a neural investment in connection.

### **Awaken - Gratitude heightens awareness**

It trains the brain to notice abundance rather than absence. Leaders who lead with gratitude see possibilities where others see problems.

**Transformative Tip:** Begin each meeting by naming one thing you're thankful for - it shifts group energy from defense to discovery.

### **Reframe - Gratitude transforms perspective**

When challenges arise, gratitude reframes stress as strategy. It reminds us: growth often hides within discomfort.

Ask, "What lesson or blessing might this moment hold?" This reframe activates resilience and optimism pathways in the prefrontal cortex.

### **Empower - Gratitude fuels generosity.**

When you lead from thankfulness, you inspire others to give their best - not because they have to, but because they want to.

Gratitude shifts culture from compliance to commitment, from surviving to thriving.

Gratitude-centered leaders don't wait for blessings - they create them through presence, empathy, and appreciation.

They understand that the most transformative leaders are those who can see the sacred in the simple - who realize that leadership is not about control, but about cultivating collective grace.

So, pause today.

Breathe. Reflect. Appreciate.

That ordinary day you're living may already be the blessing you've been praying for.
